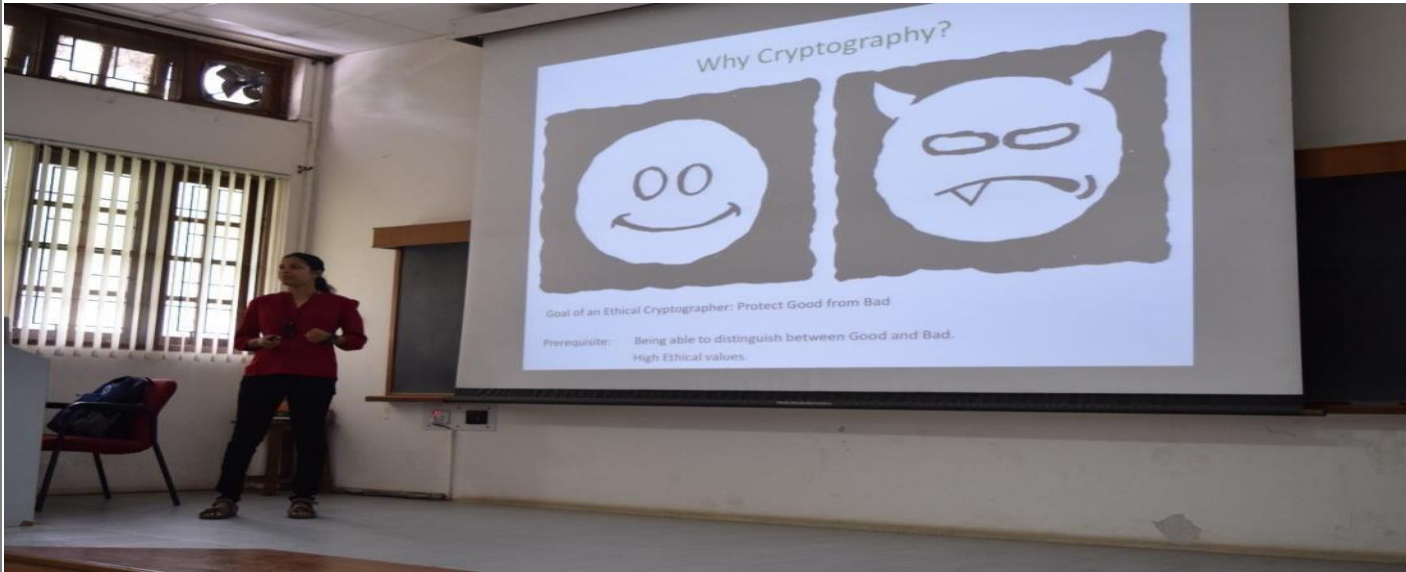




Summer School Program for Undergraduates @ IISc

Since its founding in 1909, the Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore (IISc) has emerged as India's premier destination for higher education and advanced research in all science and engineering disciplines.

IISc's Computer Science & Automation (CSA) Department was set up in 1969 with a mission to "advance the frontiers of research in computer science and automation and offer world-class pedagogical and research experience to its students". CSA is considered a Centre of Excellence by both the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Department of Science and Technology (DST). It has been ranked #71 in the Times Higher Education (THE) 2016 rankings of the 'Top 100 CS Departments Worldwide'.

About the Program:

CSA, IISc organized a Summer School program for research aspirants from July 3rd to 8th 2017, funded by Sonata Software as a part of its ongoing CSR programmes at IISc. The primary objective of the program was to introduce undergraduate students to cutting-edge research in Computer Science. 77 candidates from across India were selected to attend the program out of an applicant pool of 500 candidates.

The program was steered by two PhD students, Indu John and Ullas Aparanji. Multiple sessions were conducted over five and a half days covering both the theoretical and applied aspects of Computer Science. Participants attended talks, demos and interactive sessions by the department faculty as well as research scholars and industry experts

Impact:
